Advocacy Update

As nurses, we have lots to pay attention to, both at work and at home. It is hard to think about adding more to our full lives. As patient and family advocates, we should have concern for what is happening both locally and nationally with health care, as well as issues that impact us as professional nurses. Here are some thoughts about how and/or what may be of interest to us as nurses.

The ANA has a wonderful new initiative, #NursesVote. This is under the umbrella of their RN Action information on their website. There is a lot of information about candidates, nursing priorities, and how to get involved. Nursing priorities include Health Care Reform, Safe Staffing, Workplace Violence, Workforce Development, Opioid Epidemic, and Advance Practice initiatives, particularly as it pertains to home health care and access in rural areas.

As for NANN's focus, there is a concentration on being heard in the area of health care access for everyone. Other things we are paying attention to, and often aligning with like minded maternal health organizations, is Title VIII Workforce Development. This Public Health Service Act is the cornerstone of sustaining a robust nursing workforce as we prepare to meet the needs of America's health care. Nurses must have a voice in shaping the future of health care and advocating for access for everyone. This guarantees critical funding to meet those needs through education, strong faculty, and emphasis on minorities entering the nursing profession. This is a yearly budget item and we are always competing for our share of the pie.

Of note, NANN is discussing racial disparities, particularly as it pertains to the US Morbidity and Mortality rates of Infants and Mothers. We are raising concerns about cultural bias in the work place and how to raise personal awareness of bias.

NANN is also focusing on bipartisan legislation to advance the definition and support of paid parental leave. This is important as we hope this legislation will positively impact parents, families and our small patients. These are just a few of the issues that impact our nursing practice, our families, and our patients.

On September 12, I was excited to attend the Infant Health Policy Summit in DC. This is a yearly meeting with the National Coalition for Infant Health partnered with Alliance for Patient Access. It is eye opening and encouraging to hear from others who have similar focus and interest about our babies, our families, access, evidence based care and concern for the future of infants and women's health care.

I am happy to guide you through some advocacy ideas that will fit into your busy life. I am always available. And of course, the most important voice you have is your VOTING voice. Our patients need thoughtful nurses to make informed decisions!
